BOROUGH OF LAWNSIDE RESOLUTION NO. 44-2023

AUTHORIZING THE BOROUGH OF LAWNSIDE TO TEMPORARILY CHANGE THE WORK SCHEDULE FOR ALL BOROUGH EMPLOYEES WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, Borough Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to continue the temporarily changed work schedule for all Borough employees with the exception of the Police Department in an effort to effectuate cost savings to the Borough.

WHEREAS, the proposed changes to the work schedule have been discussed in advance with the employees both represented by unions and those not represented by unions and the employees and their representatives have consented to the continuation of these temporary changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Lawnside, County of Camden, State of New Jersey, that the work schedule for Borough employees with the exception of the Police Department shall continue to be temporarily changed to accommodate a four (4) day work week, Monday through Thursday, as follows:

- A. The Public Works Department employees shall work from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday. The Public Works Department shall be closed on Friday.
- B. Two employees of the Public Works Department shall be on call each Friday in the event of an emergency which requires that work be performed. Said employees shall not be compensated for serving in this "on call" capacity unless the employee is actually called in to perform work on a Friday.
- C. The work schedule for all other Borough employees, with the exception of the Police Department, shall be Monday through Thursday from the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 5:45 p.m.
- D. The Borough Offices shall be closed on Fridays from June 5, 2023 September 30, 2023.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this temporary work schedule shall take effect on June 5, 2023 and shall continue until through September 30, 2023.

WHEREAS, in New Jersey distracted driving was listed as a contributing circumstance in 50-percent of all motor vehicle crashes from 2016-2020; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide *Distracted Driving* 2023 Crackdown from April 1 - 30, 2023 in an effort to raise awareness and decrease driver distraction through a combination of enforcement and education; and

WHEREAS, the national slogan for the campaign is UDrive. UText. UPay; and

WHEREAS, a reduction in distracted driving in New Jersey will save lives on our roadways;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough of Lawnside declares its support for the *Distracted Driving 2023 Crackdown* both locally and nationally from April 1 - 30, 2023 and pledges to increase awareness of the dangers of distracted driving.

BOROUGH OF LAWNSIDE RESOLUTION NO. 46-2023

APPROVING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOROUGH OF LAWNSIDE AND BAY HILL ENVIRONMENTAL

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Legislature adopted new Lead Paint Legislation into law known as P.L. 2021, c. 182, to address the fact that while Lead-based paint has been banned for Residential use in the State of NJ since 1972, a large percentage of the state's older housing stock still contains lead-based paint and when left unchecked, lead-based paint can contaminate an environment which leads to harmful effects for those exposed to it; and

WHEREAS, the new law imposes an obligation on municipalities to either perform or hire a lead evaluation contractor to perform inspections of certain single-family, two-family, and multiple rental dwellings for lead-based paint hazards every three years or upon tenant turnover where there is no valid lead-safe certification; and

WHEREAS, lead-safe certificates are acquired through inspections performed by Licensed Lead Risk Assessors and the Borough of Lawnside does not have such licensed personnel on staff; and

WHEREAS, Bay Hill Environmental possesses the licensed personnel with the qualifications and experience required under P.L. 2021, c. 182, to inspect for lead-based paint hazards and has submitted a proposal that was deemed to be responsible and responsive to the tasks required under P.L. 2021, c. 182; and

WHEREAS, Bay Hill Environmental warrants that it has the qualifications, licenses, certifications and experience to perform the work specified under P.L. 2021, c. 182, and outlined herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Borough of Lawnside has approved and authorized Bay Hill Environmental as the firm to provide the required services as specified under P.L. 2021, c. 182; subject to the terms and conditions of the contract agreement.
